Thursday 18th October 2018

Our meeting was opened by Rotarian Beth Kennett who recognised and acknowledge the Rotary Club of Queanbeyan West which is described as being inland in District 9710. They have an impressive record of projects completed by the club and in addition members undertake at least 4 acts of random kindness in helping others less fortunate in the community by helping with activities such as gardening.

President Bob welcomed all to the meeting, including guest Peter Lewis and Guest Speaker John Chambers.

A/Sergeant Peter Francis had a very healthy list of alleged misdemeanours by a number of Rotarians present. The fines session ended on a happy note with Des Schirmer sharing a golden moment – the celebration of 62 years of married life with Jan. Congratulations from us all on such a wonderful achievement.

Chairman Ken Carter introduced Guest Speaker, John Chambers who is a member of Angel Flight Australia, a charity which co-ordinates non-emergency flights to assist country people to access specialist medical treatment that would otherwise be unavailable to them because of vast distance and high travel costs.

Angel Flight operates Australia-wide with a network of volunteer pilots. They come from all walks of life and donate their time, their skills and most of their aircraft costs for free. There are 3,000 registered pilots who operate a total of 20 missions every day.

A former pilot with Angel Flight Australia, John now volunteers his time as a driver, known as an earth angel, providing car transport in his own vehicle between the general aviation airports and medical facilities or nearby accommodation. There are 4,500 earth angels working as volunteers.

John explained that the services offered by Angel Flight are not recognised sufficiently in Australia and hence many people who would benefit greatly from the service are not getting access. It is vitally important that people living in regional areas are made aware that the service is available.

We appreciated John giving up his time to explain to us the wonderful work this voluntary organisation does, and in thanking him, President Bob McFarland presented a cheque for \$500 to assist Angel Flight Australia with running costs.

The raffle, drawn by John and donated by Paul Tipple was won by Barrey Niven, and the 200 Club draw went to Mike Kelly.


