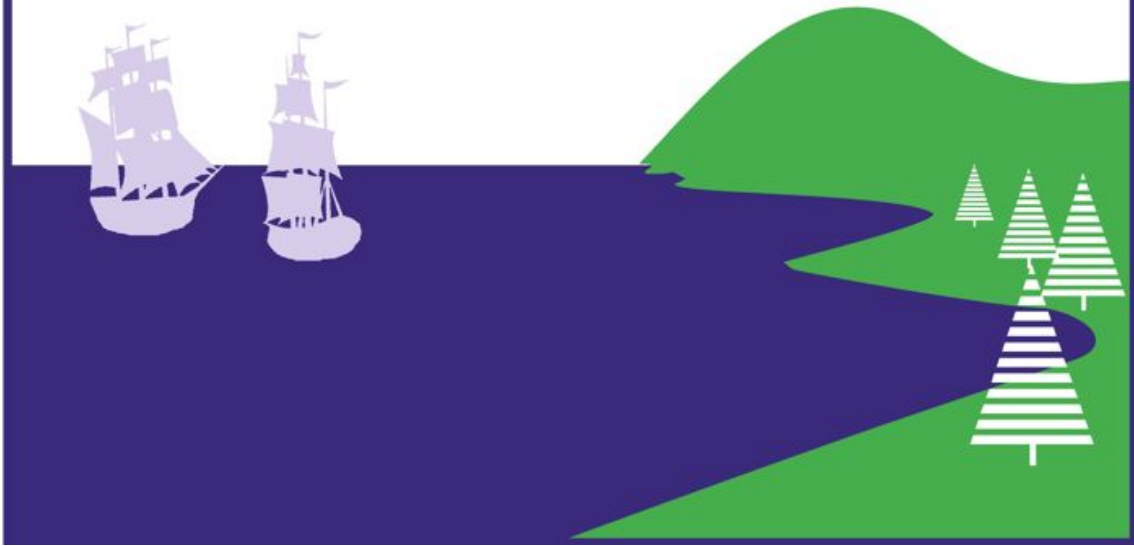

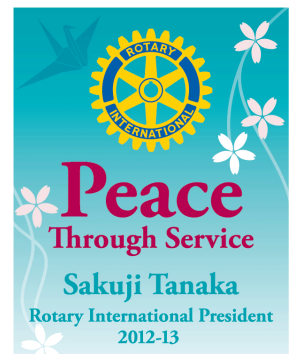

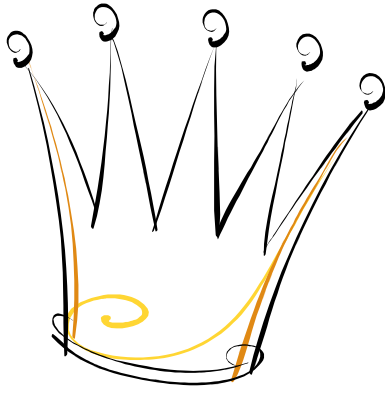

President's Report for 2011-12

Wow! How the second half of the year has rushed by, as we strived to complete our projects before changeover.

In line with International President, Kalyan Banerjee's goals on membership recruitment & a District focus for more visibility, we had a good year.

At the beginning of the year I planned to further cement the notion of succession planning & delegate the functions of the Club to the individual Directors with minimal interference from me. I also chose to enhance our role in the environmental pursuits, without being a 'rusted on' greeny.



We also set out to make Rotary in Victor Harbor more visible, with signage on our projects, at the Lions Information bay on Adelaide Road & the new Riding for the Disabled arena at Morgan Park & hopefully, by the end of the year, at Kent Reserve BBQ site. Also we have completed our display cabinet at the Library.

Environmentally, we planned from the outset, to make a difference to the removal of E-Waste from our community. We hadn't planned for it to take the path it did, but my congratulations go to Bob McFarland for coming up with the idea, after reading an advert in the 'Times'. What a successful project it was. We also achieved two visits to Calperum Station, joining with the Rotary Club of Brownhill Creek, with two more planned for the coming year. This time they will be during the school holidays. I thank Brian Rodan for his efforts in this area, along with our two tree planting days.

Other Community Service projects, that I found very pleasing, were the painting of the inside of the CWA rooms, the completion of the Kent Reserve BBQ Shelter, the completion of the Paving project for the Victor Harbor Kindergarten & the provision of electric power tools for the Special Education Unit at the Victor Harbor High School. Perhaps the most gratifying project was the fencing & provision of a portable (chemical) toilet for the Riding for the Disabled's new arena at Morgan Park. This was achieved by partnering with the Rotary Club of Victor Harbor & accessing a District Simplified Grant. I extend my thanks to RCVH President Graham Ewens & his team for their assistance. My thanks go to Director Mike Ryan for co-ordinating these projects.

The Club is very proud to be the first group to create an award through the Fleurieu Foundation. It will be known as the Rotary Club of Encounter Bay – Wally Bradley Award & has been established to support young people in Victor Harbor aged 16-19 years who show initiative & commitment in their field of education or training, but who may be experiencing difficulty in continuing their studies, or accessing other education or training, due to hardship or disadvantage. The Award is based on access & equity. It is not intended to be a merit award that just recognises academic achievement. We expect the first award will be offered in August 2012 for an amount of \$400.

Club Service – Gill Houlihan has managed a large team that looks after the running of the Club, with co-operation & support from her sub-committees. Of note would be a continuing excellent weekly Bulletin & our District 9520 Award winning Website. A huge thankyou & congratulations must go to Peter Manuel for his tireless efforts. Our weekly program, co-ordinated by Michael Harris, was diverse & interesting, providing a good mix of entertainment & information. Well done Michael.

Three Rotarians from last year decided not to continue into 2011-12, for various reasons & we were only able to recruit one new member. We are very privileged to have gained the services of former Apexian ‘everything’, Brenton Abbott. On an extremely encouraging aspect, we retained all members for the whole year, one of the measures in the Presidential Citation that we did meet.

Two other great fellowship nights, enjoyed by the Club, were the Progressive Dinner hosted by Don & Beth Kennett, Alan & Bev Kluske, with sweets at the home of Gill & Paul Houlihan. The other one, unfortunately I was away, was the joint social night with the RCVH at the home of Tim Sheirlaw.

Vocational Service had a quiet year as much of the traditional activities have moved across to New Generations, the new 5th service arm of Rotary. We were able to visit the radio station 90.1 Happy FM for a meeting to draw the Boat Raffle & later in the year we recognised a businessman for his continuous service to the community. My thanks go to Don Kennett & his team.

International Service also lost the youth exchange program to New Generations & we had to swap Directors half way through the year due to an increase in Wendy’s’ family & work commitments. Notwithstanding these minor distractions Wendy & Alan led a team that delivered a great program for the visiting GSE team from Sweden & the International night at David & Janice Virgin’s is always a high-light, raising much needed funds for the New Life Africa International School (formerly Filadelfia School) in Nakuru, Kenya.

Another aspect to The Rotary Foundation, based again on the Presidential Citation, the Club approved a donation to the TRF for every member of the Club. It is known as EREY (Every Rotarian Every Year). Those, along with our Centurion donors, have boosted our contributions to TRF.

I would like to place on record my personal congratulations to the people whom the Club has recognised with PHF’s (Paul Harris Fellows) & Sapphire Pins this year. At our 32nd Birthday, on 15th Sep, charter member Ian Warner received his 1st Sapphire pin, then, at the re-introduced Group 4 Foundation dinner on 20th Mar, Alan Kluske received his 1st Sapphire pin & IPP Peter Francis was awarded with a PHF for his service through Rotary & with the Pt. Elliot Surf Lifesaving Club. Awards well deserved. But wait, there’s more.....

New Generations, the new 5th arm of Rotary Service was formerly introduced into Rotary this year. Aply led by Stewart Leggett, his team involved students in many Rotary programs. We were offering many more, but received no applications. RYDA, which now has had a name change, was shifted, by our District, to Sep 2012, so we didn’t have a driver awareness program this year. Our Club, as I find when visiting other Clubs, is having difficulty in encouraging host families for the LTYE program. This year we joined with the RCVH to host Adele, from Belgium & what a breath of fresh air she has been. It is exchange students like Adele that make us strive harder to try to continue in this program.

I would like to thank those Club members who supported District activities away from our Club. There was the Foundation Dinner (Hotel Crown), farewell to the GSE team from Denmark (Strathalbyn), Calperum Station (Renmark), District Conference (Mildura – next year Barossa) & the District Assembly (Murray Bridge).

During the year, I visited the following Rotary Clubs: Goolwa, Strathalbyn, Yankalilla, Cairns North, Cairns Sunrise, Queen Mary 2 (3 times) & Coffs Harbour Daybreak.

Whilst ‘Succession Planning’ was a goal for my year, I didn’t know I was going to rely on it as much as I did, with my illness, as well as the holidays, that had been pre-committed. I thank the Board & members most sincerely, for keeping the Club running through these times, as you have done on many occasions before. The only difference is that the District now has a name for it.

The Board has met regularly & all played their part in the running of the Club. I extend my special thanks to retiring Secretary Marilyn, for keeping me informed on activities & reports to which I needed to attend. Best wishes for your new role as Director – International Service. Our Treasurer Mike Price will be returning to the ‘benches’ for a much deserved rest after 2 years looking after the Club funds. Other members retiring from the Board for next year are Don Kennett, Mike Ryan & Stewart Leggett. Thank you all for a job well done.

Finally, I would like to sincerely thank all of our active Past Presidents’ & Assistant Governor Deidre, for their counsel & support during the year. Without that advice, from time to time, I could have been floundering.

I would be remiss if I didn’t recognise the effort that my wife, Judith, has made to help me have a good year as President. She is not a great one for attending functions, but her preparation & nibbles for Board meetings, the ‘camp cook’ when we attend Calperum, along with many other aspects are much appreciated. Thank you. And what about those table decorations she’s created.

Last of all I would like to congratulate PE Ken Carter for being elected to the highest office in our Club & I look forward to working with you & your Board for another successful year of the Rotary Club of Encounter Bay.

Kevin Sorrell and his band of helpers once again had a successful garage sale and incorporated the good book sale resulting in a net profit of \$877.45

This year our club has been involved in various community activities with many of our members participating. Some of our projects included;

The final touch to the Victor Harbor Child Care Centre project was the laying of the pavers showing the RCEB logo.

Victor Harbor High School Special Education Unit: The club provided the necessary funds to allow the school to purchase a range of power tools, enabling the students to further develop wood working skills.

Riding for the Disabled: The club volunteers helped in the relocation of RDA to its new site at Morgan Park. The members put up fencing and painted posts for the new stalls. In association with the Rotary Club of Victor Harbor we provided funding for the purchase and installation of a toilet, for the disabled, at the new site.

Country Women's Association: The club has under taken the large task of painting the CWA hall the large meeting room and the kitchen has been painted. This project is ongoing.

Zonta: Funds and volunteers provided to help the Zonta Club purchase and pack birthing kits for use in developing countries.

Events SA: Members of the club volunteered to be trained by SAPOL to be traffic marshals for the tour down under.

Triathlon; The club supported the Victor Harbor Triathlons in Nov 2011 and March 2012. Members helped in the setting up of the transition area, erecting safety barriers and signage and acted as marshals during the events. The funds received from the event have been donated to the Sidzwheelz appeal.

Fleurieu Community Foundation: We have completed the documentation to launch the annual "Rotary Club of Encounter Bay - Wally Bradley Award". It is an award established to support young people in Victor Harbor aged 16-19 years who show initiative and commitment in their field of education or training but who may be experiencing difficulty in continuing their studies, or accessing other education or training, due to hardship or disadvantage. The Award is based on access and equity. It is not intended to be a merit award that just recognises academic achievement. It is expected the first awards will be offered in 2012 for an amount of \$400.

Southern Communities Transport Scheme. We have been able to provide a cash donation to assist in the replacement of one of their vehicles in March 2012.

Australian Rotary Health. Again we have been able to support this worthy cause by participating in the Rotary Hat Day in May.

Breast of Friends: A cancer support group for survivors of breast cancer have been supported by us with the provision of a portable Laser Therapy Unit that patients can borrow & use at home.

Library Display: We have finally completed our display on the top shelf of the display case at the Library.

Our Board has also provided a cash donation to the Prostate Cancer Foundation.

Rotary Branding: We have been able to put our signs in noticeable places at the venues we have assisted this year - VHHS Special Education Unit, CWA, Lions Information Bay on Adelaide Road and RDA Toilet & Grounds. Before the end of the year we hope to have the Rotary Wheel in place at the BBQ Shelter in Kent Reserve.



Environment Committee Report

Roadside Clean up; Only 5 bags of rubbish was collected in March during the Roadside Clean-up as part of Clean-up Australia Day.

Calperum Station; This former run down sheep station is now owned by the Director of National Parks. The management of the property has been transferred to the Australian Landscape Trust to undertake biodiversity, conservation & sustainable management activities. Under permit, Rotarians from around Australia have been assisting in revegetating the property while enjoying fun & fellowship. This Rotary year, President Bob, in conjunction with members of the Rotary Club of Brownhill Creek made 2 visits to Calperum Station, with the catering in the capable hands of Bob's wife, Judith.

Tree Planting; We have had 3 tree planting exercises undertaken in the last 3 years by the members of the Encounter Bay Rotary Club, under the guidance of the Victor Harbor City Council.

Waste Collection; During the month of May, we provided a service to the community by collecting e-waste for a small fee & taking advantage of the free deposit at the Goolwa Tip. In all we collected from 73 sites with 135 items of E Waste recovered. The project netted over \$900.00

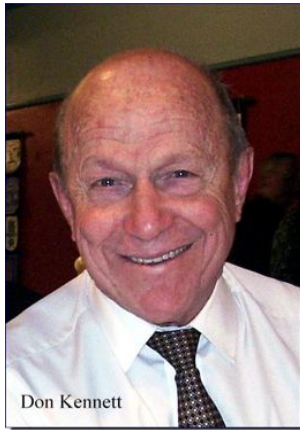

Brian Heyes (Correctional Services) was our second speaker when we learnt about Brian's career in taking care of some of our naughty boys.

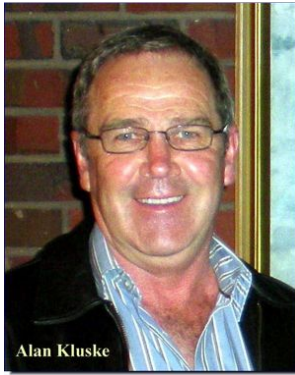
Special Vocational Speakers (External)

The International Committee has had quite a successful year, starting with the arrival of our long term Youth Exchange Student Adele Pierre. Whilst Adele is in the care of the New Generations Committee she has been a big part of our International Committee. Wendy Brearley from the International Committee was Adele's councillor. Adele settled into our club very well and made friends easily, it was a pleasure to have her with us.

We were also privileged to host the Group Study Exchange team from Sweden ably led by Team leader Urs Gobel. Malin Berge, Fredrik Brakenhielm, Sofie Karlsson and Johan Haglund were well received by their host families and I'm sure friendships were made. The group were very vocational orientated with some having to report back regularly to their employers, but we still managed to give them a great look around our area thanks to David Virgin and the Hotel Victor bus. Rather than the usual trip to the Coorong we decided to show them more of what Victor Harbor & Port Elliot had to offer with visits to Granite Island, The Bluff, a walk along the Heysen Trail and a nice walk around Port Elliot with pie & pasty lunch from the renowned Port Elliot Bakery and a trip around Goolwa. We also catered for their vocational visits thanks to the generosity of our local business community. A special thanks to the Hotel Victor for the loan of their courtesy bus, and David & Janice Virgin for their hosting & help planning the GSE visit.

The International Committee held a fund raising night at David & Janice Virgin's home with the proceeds going to New Life Africa International (formally known as the Filadelfia School) in Nakuru, Kenya. The evening raised over \$1500.00 and the club rounded the amount up to \$2000.00, with David & Janice visiting Nakuru they were able to take the proceeds with them which maximised the funds raised to go towards school uniforms for the students. The new uniforms now have the school name and logo, plus motto "Strive to Excel". Uniforms are a very important part of the school. In earlier years the students were ridiculed around this area for not having a school uniform, this not only helps with self-esteem and better education it helps enhance their job prospects. At the city dump they have also started a small nursery school and these children also have a school uniform. The teachers and parents are continually grateful for the support given from our Rotary Club towards funding the uniforms.



The board has also supported Leanne Rogerson to join the Mercy Ships for a year, by paying her "crew fees" (board & meals) for a month. The board also supported Australian Rotary Health with \$1,000.00 and The Rotary Foundation \$2000.00 from end of year disbursements. During the year the Board also provided A\$1,350 funds to TRF for their EREY (Every Rotarian Every Year) program at US\$31.58 per member. The Board also approved the purchase of a Shelter Box from Shelter Box Australia, \$1,200 & one from Disaster Australia, \$800.

I would like to thank my committee members, plus David Virgin, and club members for the support given throughout this Rotary year.

Director of New Generations Stewart Leggett

This was a very busy portfolio involving young people – with particular emphasis on the gaining of skills and confidence for employment. I will cover some significant highlights on activities during the year.

Finance:

My original financial estimate for New Generations of \$12,130, which included estimates for two students to attend NYSF at \$3,460, fell well short. From a fund-raising perspective we had to find \$2,216, which was made easy with \$3,000 being carried over from the previous Community Peoples lottery. The Community lottery for 2012, which is about to end, will net us \$2,285.



Activities during 2011– 2012 include: This year we shared a LTYE student, Adele Pierre, with the RC of Victor Harbor. Adele came to us in July, from Charleroi in Belgium. Whilst with our Club she was hosted by Ken & Kathy Carter, followed by Mike and Gayle Price. She has been a great ambassador for LTYE and is a competent Violinist & Flutist.

Emma Walker from Victor Harbor High School represented our Club at the Royal Adventure in Citizenship in Canberra in May 2011. She addressed our Rotary Club in August 2011.

Laura McLeod was chosen to be sponsored by our Club to attend a RYLA Seminar at Belair in September 2011. However, she was unable to attend at the last moment because of a serious illness. The \$810 paid for her to attend was refunded and she has been offered the opportunity to attend later this year.

As a Club, we sponsored a young Mt Compass student Harry Grindle to attend the Health of the River System Youth Forum at Lake Cullulleraine in November 2011. Harry is an outstanding student with enormous potential and after attending the Seminar he spoke at our Rotary Club earlier in the year.

In April we sponsored two Victor Harbor year 11 students to attend the RYPEN, Youth Program of Enrichment weekend which was held at the Woodhouse Scout Centre in Piccadilly. The two students, Elise Tuuri and Donna Perry learnt a great deal from the Seminar and will be invited to give a brief report at a Club meeting later this year. The total cost for this seminar to sponsor the girls was \$500.

Our Club also provided two \$300 Academic Awards to Students at the Victor Harbor High School

We also made a \$200 donation to RYWELL – Rotary Youth Wellbeing.

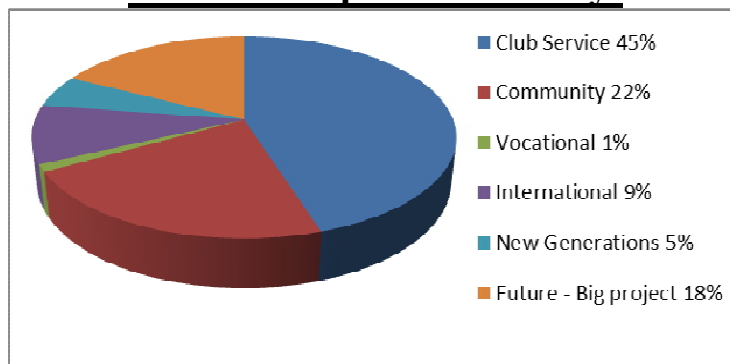

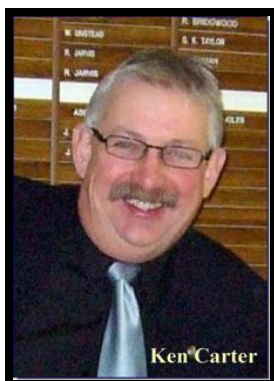

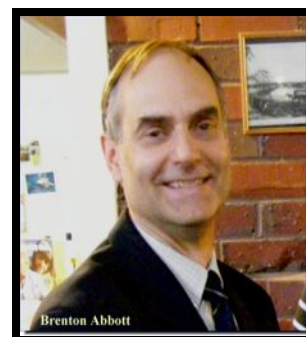
