<u>Member Interview – Ken Carter</u> (Conversation with Peter Manuel)

This week Ken chatted to Dr Peter Manuel (right) who was inducted to the RCEB on 19th July 2001.

Speaking about his career as a successful secondary school teacher and Principal, Peter told us his first posting after graduating was as Principal of Wudinna Area School. The many interesting positions he held included as Director of Education for eight years. Teaching appointments necessitated him having to live in 15 different locations throughout South Australia and one of the more demanding postings was as Principal of Golden Grove High School for 8 years. Peter's final position was as Principal at the Victor Harbor High School when he retired in 2003.

GUEST SPEAKER – DEAN JAMIESON, Author, "They called me Lightning".

Chairman Alan Mullins introduced Guest Speaker, Dean Jamieson who spoke to us about the book he has written, "They called me Lightning", which is his story starting at the age of sixteen when he left school to learn to be a stockman. The book is a fascinating story of Dean growing up while learning to deal with life on outback stations in South Australia and the Northern Territory in the late 1950's and early 1960's.

From stepping of the Old Ghan at a rail siding in the middle of the night, to living off the land with Aboriginal people in the Simpson Desert, learning to muster cattle, chasing brumbies along the Birdsville Track and explaining how he

earned his nickname "Lightning", Dean recounted the amazing time in his life working on outback stations in an absorbing tale of fear, survival and adventure. He gave us a tantalising glimpse into what was certainly a challenging, adventurous and rewarding time.



All proceeds from the sale of his book go to the charity FOP Australia. FOP is an ultra rare genetic condition, affecting only 19 people in Australia and 2 in New Zealand as of June 2020. FOP causes bone to form in muscle and soft tissue, leading to progressive painful and permanent loss of movement. Dean and Jenny's daughter suffers from the FOP which Dean describes as a cruel disease. Community support for the established charity has enabled \$100,000 to be raised towards research into finding a cure, but more help is needed.

Dean concluded by saying to us that everyone has a story to tell. "Make sure you keep your stories."



We appreciate very much Dean coming to our meeting and sharing with us just a few of the many remarkable stories in his book.
